The Karunya Benevolent Fund is an assurance scheme by the State Government which provides financial aid for poor people suffering from serious ailments, by raising funds through the Kerala lottery. The scheme is managed by the State Lotteries Department (Taxes).

The scheme provides Secondary and Tertiary care as per the Karunya Arogya Suraksha Padhathi (KASP) packages which provides cashless cover of up to INR 5,00,000 to each eligible family per year.

- The applicant should be a resident of Kerala.
- The applicant should have an annual family income of less than INR 3,00,000

04/ Application Process

- Approach KASP empanelled hospitals.
- Submit the application form along with the necessary documents.

05/ Claims

- The patient has to visit the empanelled hospital with the required documents.
- If the procedure required is part of the package covered under the scheme, then cashless medical cover will be provided.

The entire cost of treatment, including the cost of investigations, will be borne by the hospitals through the funds provided by the Mission.

- The applications scrutinised are sent from Anganwadi or ICDS Office to the Executive Director of Social Security Mission at Trivandrum.
- The amount will be credited to the bank account of the applicant.
- For any queries contact the nearest Anganwadi or ICDS Office.
- In case of change of the caregiver due to death of the caregiver or any other reasons, a new application needs to be initiated to receive the benefit.

The scheme is intended to provide comprehensive health insurance coverage to all serving employees of the State Government including the High Court of Kerala who are covered under the existing Kerala Government Servants Medical Attendant Rules [KGSMARules, 1960] and pensioners.

This also includes newly recruited employees and their family, part-time contingent employees, part-time teachers, teaching, non-teaching staff of aided schools and colleges and their family and pensioners and their spouses and family pensioners on compulsory basis, and all Civil Service Officers serving under the Government of Kerala on optional basis.

The Chief Minister Distress Relief Fund (CMDRF) is a public fund constituted for the purpose of giving relief to those affected by fire, flood, cyclone, sea erosion and similar other calamities. Educational, Cultural and Charitable Institutions of public nature, which are affected by such calamities and whose financial position does not enable them to repair the damage caused to their property and bring them to a normal condition are also eligible for financial assistance from the Fund.

Relief may also be provided from the Distress Relief Fund for the workers thrown out of employment for reasons beyond their control, in units not covered by Employees State Insurance Schemes or Employees Provident Fund Schemes in the traditional sector alone.

Financial Assistance from this Fund will be restricted to cases not covered by other special relief programs of the Government. The term "Privation" does not refer to ordinary cases of poverty, but refers only to exceptional cases of real hardship due to sudden loss of income where the District Collector is satisfied that financial assistance would be necessary.

The Employee State Insurance Scheme (ESIC) provides medical facilities to insured persons and their families.

01.2/ Type

- Employee State Insurance Scheme

01.3/ States Covered

02/ Benefits

This scheme operates differently for Medical Disability, Unemployment, Funeral Costs, Sickness, Rehabilitation, and Old-Age Care.

03/ Eligibility

The beneficiary should be an Insured member or family member of the insured person

04/ Application Process

- The Empaneled Centre will submit the bill for payment to the Medical Superintendent concerned with necessary supporting documents immediately after completion of treatment in respect of ESIC beneficiaries referred/permitted by the respective Medical Superintendents.
- The Medical Superintendents shall, however, ensure the release of payment within 3 (three) working days after submission of the bills by the tie-up hospitals. Three days include the processing of bills by Medical Superintendents and the release of payment by the Accounts Branch concerned.
- The Empaneled Centre shall directly charge the individuals for telephone charges and extra diet charges, so incurred by the patient or any of his family members during their stay in the Empanelled Centre.

- Employees must show their ESIC ID card issued by their employer at the hospital.
- The hospital will then process the application for verification and approval.
