01/ Overview

01.1/ About

This scheme provides financial assistance for the medical treatment of serious ailments for registered construction workers and their family members for diseases. This scheme also covers treatment for all types of cancers.

02/ Benefits

This scheme provides financial assistance of INR 1,00,000.

03/ Eligibility

- Any registered construction labourer, irrespective of their gender, between the age of 18-60 years is eligible.
- The worker themselves or their blood relatives must be suffering from a critical illness.
- Should currently be residing in Maharashtra.
- The applicant should not have been covered in the government health insurance scheme.

04/ Application Process

- The Application Form is available at District Labour Offices and — https://mahabocw.in/wp-content/uploads/2019/06/SCHEME_HEALTH_FORM-1.pdf
- Fill in the Form and submit it with the required documents at the District Labour Office.

05/ Claims

Once the application is submitted, it will be verified, and the sanctioned amount will be transferred directly to the bank account of the beneficiary.

Maharashtra – 02 / Indigent Patient Fund Scheme in Charitable Trust Hospitals under Charity Commissioner

01/ Overview

01.1/ About

The Charity Commissioner of Maharashtra has established a scheme to provide financial assistance to patients who require medical treatment for all types of cancer.

Each public charitable hospital has created an Indigent Patients' Fund (IPF) in which it credits 2% of the gross billing of all patients (other than indigent and weaker section patients). Also, all other donations received by the Institute for providing medical treatment to the indigent and weaker section patients shall be credited to the IPF Account.

This scheme is intended to provide support to patients from economically weaker sections of society who may not have the means to pay for cancer treatment.

Treatments can cover the cost of chemotherapy, radiation therapy, surgery, and other medical expenses related to cancer treatment.

02/ Benefits

- The hospital registered as a charitable trust should reserve 10% of the beds for indigent patients and 10% for patients from lower economic backgrounds.
- Under this scheme, hospitals provide medical treatment to indigent patients free of cost and at a concessional rate to the weaker section of patients. For medicines, consumables, and implants, the weaker section patients shall pay at least 50% of the bills.
Charitable Hospitals shall provide the following –
- Non-billable services free to the indigent patients as well as weaker section patients.
Bed
- RMO Services
- Nursing Care
- Food (if provided by the hospital)
- Linen
- Water
- Electricity
- Routine Diagnostics as required for treatment of General Specialties.
- House-Keeping Services.

03/ Eligibility

- For Indigent Patients, Annual Family Income should be less than INR 1,80,000.
- For Economically Weaker Section Patients, their annual family income should be less than INR 3,60,000.

 - The Social Worker will guide you if there is any vacant bed under the Charity Commissioner Scheme otherwise he will give the next possible date to admit.

01/ Overview

01.1/ About

This scheme provides medical assistance of up to INR 5,00,000 per family to all residents of Maharashtra State. Registered BOCW workers who are not the permanent residents of Maharashtra are eligible for this scheme. Further, non-residents of Maharashtra who have suffered road accident within the boundaries of the state can receive benefit under this scheme.

The scheme provides cashless medical insurance of up to INR 5,00,000 per family.

03/ Eligibility

- The patient should be a resident of Maharashtra OR
- The patient should be a registered construction worker working in Maharashtra OR
- The patient should be a non-resident of Maharashtra who are victims of road accidents taking medical treatment in a hospital in Maharashtra.

04/ Application Process

- The applicant needs to approach the nearest empanelled hospital that provides the benefits under this scheme.
- At the time of hospitalisation, the applicant needs to provide his or her Aadhar Card or Ration Card for eligibility verification.
- If the citizen already has the Ayushman Card, then that can be produced. Otherwise, based on the Aadhar or Ration Card details, the applicant's status is checked and an Ayushman Card is generated.

05/ Claims

- Visit your nearest network hospital to get your medical condition diagnosed.
- The hospital authorities will send a digital pre-authorization request to the insurance company.
- Upon approval, the treatment procedure will commence. In case of emergencies, this procedure is instant and is not delayed by e-authorization requirements.
- If the diagnosis does not take place in a network hospital, then the Arogyamitra will issue a referral card. You need to produce this card at an empanelled hospital to avail of cashless treatment.

- After completing the medical procedure, the network hospital will share all essential details like diagnostic reports, treatment summary, and final bill with the insurer. The latter will verify all submitted documents to initiate claim settlement.

This scheme provides medical assistance of up to INR 5,00,000 per family to all poor families in the Maharashtra State.

02/ Benefits

The scheme provides Financial Assistance up to INR 1,500 per month and is given to a single beneficiary whose family annual income is up to INR 21,000.

03/ Eligibility

- The applicant should be a person suffering from major illnesses (like cancer).
- The applicant should be less than 65 years of age.
- Annual family income of the applicant should be up to INR 21,000 (In the case of a disabled person, the income limit is INR 50,000).
- If the applicant has some disability, it should be more than 40%.
- The applicant should be a resident of Maharashtra for at least 15 years.

04/ Application Process

- Approach either the local Talathi Office or the Block/District Office of the Social Justice and Special Assistance Department.
- Avail the form and submit it with the documents mentioned below.
- The selection of the beneficiary is done by the locally appointed “Sanjay Gandhi Niradhar Yojana Samiti”.
- A list of final beneficiaries will be put out in the office where the application was submitted.
- The money is transferred to the beneficiary’s bank account. The department will suggest opening a bank account if you do not have one already.

- If the cost of surgical treatment is INR 1,50,000 or less, then the subsidy is not given.

- The patient should be undergoing treatment in the hospitals registered in the institution's grant list (subsidies are not given to the patients who are undergoing surgery or treatment in the hospital of the Sansthan).
- He/she should not be eligible for the Mahatma Phule Jan Arogya Yojana or Ayushman Bharat Yojana.
- Applicant's annual family income should be below INR 1,60,000 for Orange Ration Card and INR 85,000 for Yellow Ration Card.
Applicant's name should be mentioned in the Ration Card.

The application must be sent to the trust by filling up the designated form, attaching all required documents, and a cost estimate certificate from the hospital.

- Visit the Medical Social Worker at Tata Memorial hospital in the Bhabha Building.
- Patients are enrolled after clinical evaluation by Dr. Sudeep Gupta and a thorough documentation check by the Medical Social Worker.
- Documents required to be submitted for verification purposes are the Income Certificate, Ration Card of the family, and Salary Slip if any of the individual.

The Chief Minister's Relief Fund (CMRF) is a financial assistance scheme initiated by the government of Maharashtra to provide aid to individuals facing financial difficulties in accessing medical treatment for serious illnesses like cancer (all types).

This scheme provides financial assistance of up to INR 2,00,000.

03/ Eligibility

- Annual Income should be less than INR 1,60,000.
- If the applicant is not eligible for Mahatma Phule Jan Aarogya Yojana, Charity Commissioner Hospitals, Rashtriya Bal Swasthya Karyakram then only he/she is eligible for CM Relief Fund.
- The applicant should be admitted to the hospital to get the benefit.
- If the applicant gets discharged from a non-empanelled hospital then he/she will not get the benefits from the CM Relief Fund.

Note – If the application is submitted via email, then the physical copy of that application along all the necessary documents needs to be submitted by post to the CM Relief Fund Office at Mantralaya.

The Employee State Insurance Scheme (ESIC) provides medical facilities to insured persons and their families.

01.2/ Type

Employee State
Insurance Scheme

01.3/ States Covered

Maharashtra

02/ Benefits

This scheme operates differently for Medical Disability, Unemployment, Funeral Costs, Sickness, Rehabilitation, and Old-Age Care.

03/ Eligibility

The beneficiary should be an Insured member or family member of the insured person.

04/ Application Process

- The Empaneled Centre will submit the bill for payment to the Medical Superintendent concerned with necessary supporting documents immediately after completion of treatment in respect of ESIC beneficiaries referred/permitted by the respective Medical Superintendents.
- The Medical Superintendents shall, however, ensure the release of payment within 3 (three) working days after submission of the bills by the tie-up hospitals. Three days include the processing of bills by Medical Superintendents and the release of payment by the Accounts Branch concerned.
- The Empaneled Centre shall directly charge the individuals for Telephone Charges and Extra Diet Charges, so incurred by the patient or any of his family members during their stay in the empanelled Centre.

- Employees must show their ESIC ID card issued by their employer at the hospital.
- The hospital will then process the application for verification and approval.
